My name is Grace Leavitt. I am a recently retired educator and reside in Raymond. I am writing in support of LD 900, "An Act to Protect State Retiree Pensions from Inflation".

I am fully aware that there is a high fiscal note for this proposed legislation, and am equally aware that, were it to be supported, the funds would not be there to implement it at this time. Nonetheless, this is an issue that needs to be addressed whenever it might be possible to do so. And thus we will likely continue to ask for these improvements to be made.
