Hello Committee.

This language and framing of 3D Printed Guns as distinctly criminal creates a legal category of firearm that allows for massive overreach and corruption by law enforcement.

This Bill allows for Law Enforcement to at will place a normal firearm component with honest Citizens and then accuse them of a crime. The accused citizen would then be without means to prove their innocence in any way as the point of manufacture is undetermined.

This bill also creates no structure for individuals who wish to comply to register or serialize their firearms should they wish. Unless the state wishes to compensate individuals who have already legally manufactured firearms, which is their constitutional right, this bill is supposing to criminalize vast quantities of individuals private property under the guise of public safety.

Firearms manufacture is a tradition and legacy of the United States. To criminalize with so little thought is gross overreach of justice, violation of the 2nd Amendment, and frankly a disservice to all of our intelligence.

A majority of firearms used in crimes are legally purchased, and often stolen, both of which already have provisions in place to ensure compliance within the bounds of the law. To so rapidly expand the definitions of a crime with no victim is unnecessary and misguided.
