Testimony by **Richard Atlee** of Southwest Harbor in response to

LD69: An Act to Repeal the Law Restricting the Use of Certain Plastic, Paper and Singleuse Bags

**Summary: Ought not to pass** 

Senator Tepler and Representative Doudera and members of the Joint Committee on Environment and Natural Resources:

As someone who was involved in the work leading up to the passage of 38 MRSA §1611, I would like to make the following points supporting a position of "**Ought not to pass**" on LD69:

- 1. **Whereas,** the danger to the health of Maine residents presented by the growing body burden of micro- and nano-plastics has been solidly demonstrated by an ever-increasing body of research, and
- 2. **Whereas,** prior to the passage of 38 MRSA §1611 the evidence of environmental accumulation of single-use carry-out bags was impossible to ignore, and the problems posed to recycling operations by such plastic films, and
- 3. **Whereas,** the subsequent reduction in the presence of these bags in our environment has been clear, therefore
- 4. Until proper research and analysis has demonstrated that this reduction has not reduced the threat to Maine's health and environment, 38 MRSA §1611 should not be repealed.
