It guarantees that any future state projects affecting tribal lands will only proceed after meaningful consultation with tribal governments, ensuring that all decisions are made collaboratively. Passing LD 958 is a crucial step toward justice and equality for the Wabanaki Nations. It reaffirms their right to protect their lands and cultural heritage as sovereign governments, ensuring they are treated on par with other federally recognized tribes. I urge you to support this bill and help restore fairness for the Wabanaki Nations.
