Members of the Labor Committee,

My name is Bethany Allen, I reside in Bowdoinham, Maine, and I own Harvest Tide Organics, a 50 acre organic vegetable farm that sells vegetables directly to Mainers through a CSA and wholesale to regional distributors. We have been in business for 10 years and currently employ 10-16 people depending on the season. I am submitting this testimony to assert my support for the proposed legislation LD 357 in support of a minimum wage for agricultural workers.

I will keep this brief, members of the committee, you should absolutely support this bill. As a farm, we have never paid anyone even close to the minimum wage on our farm. I don't honestly know any farm who has, even as the minimum wage has risen in Maine. While there are a number of ways that farming can be different from other types of employment, I can't think of any reason that would justify paying any Mainer below the state minimum wage.

This bill will not affect in any way my ability to succeed or grow as a business in Maine, or to attract employees to work on the farm. It is my belief that this bill protects the *most vulnerable* populations farming in Maine, and that is an important and critical measure that should be taken given the historical abuses associated with farm work.
