RE: LD 1187-- An Act to Require Certain Mental Health Data to Be Included in
Uniform Crime Reports

Dear Senator Beebe-Center, Representative Hasenfus, and Members of the
Criminal Justice and Public Safety Committee:

MACDL is neither for nor against LD 1187.

In a vacuum MACDL supports the concept of gathering information on mental health referrals. More information is generally better than less information. In this instance, the information could help us better understand if the State is allocating resources correctly, or if resources should be redirected, and it should give us insight into whether or not increased training and education on mental health is making an impact.

MACDL's trepidation in supporting this bill is the uncertainty about who would have access to the information, exactly what information would be collected, and how that information would be securely stored. MACDL wants to ensure that the privacy interests of those whose data is collected is not abused or made public.

What information is collected is not specified in statute but left up to the State Bureau of Identification to determine. See Title 25 §1544. This means that there could be identifiable personal information that could be collected. And even if the State Bureau of Identification were to testify that they do not collect identifiable information there is nothing in the statute that would restrain them from collecting that data tomorrow.

For the reasons stated above, MACDL is neither for nor against LD 1187.
