LD 421 An Act to Eliminate Barriers to Reentry into the Community After Incarceration by Repealing Certain Driver's License Suspension Provisions

Senator Beebe-Center, Representative Hasenfus and distinguished members of Joint Committee on Criminal Justice and Public Safety;

My name is Dorothy Odell and I live in Belfast. I represent the Legislative Committee of Restorative Justice Project Maine which supports LD 421 and asks that you unanimously recommend its passage.

This bill is important to our organization, which was critical in helping to establish the Reentry Center in Waldo County. Over the past twenty years, our staff and volunteers have helped many men transition successfully transition back to the community from incarceration. Our experience has shown that the challenge of taking responsibility for basic needs such as food and housing after years in prison cannot be overstated.

The first order of business is likely to be finding a job, but without a driver's license, there may be no way to get to the interview, let alone report for work on time, day after day. In a state with limited or non-existent public transportation, it is almost impossible for the average person to get along without being able to drive a car.

If we want to lower the recidivism rate, save thousands of dollars, and serve the best interests of our citizens, then it is foolish to stand in the way of someone trying to lead a normal life after incarceration by denying them the right to obtain a driver's license.
