On behalf of the BRCC Board of Directors, I am providing testimony in support of LD 281, An Act to Provide Support for Certain Maine Discovery Museum Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics Educational Programming Throughout the State

The funding from this bill will provide critical support to three programs: the Maine Science Festival, Maine Invention Convention, and Science Around Maine. The programs this bill will support are critical to the success of not only the Bangor region, but the state of Maine.

These programs offer access to science based education and experiences to young people (and adults) who might not otherwise have access to these opportunities, particularly those in rural communities. These programs also enhance our region's and state's economy by bringing visitors, both in-state and out of state, to participate in these unique learning experiences and opportunities.

This funding will also allow the Maine Discovery Museum to provide programming at no charge to continue to further their educational outreach and impact. As is the case with many nonprofit organizations, access to funding to support existing programs of this kind has become more and more challenging given the current economic conditions and uncertainty.

This investment will pay off for many years and throughout multiple generations as we support the educational infrastructure in the sciences that will lead to future discoveries, innovation and jobs in Maine.
