This is where the Dependent Exemption Tax Credit comes in—it's money that parents and caregivers can use for whatever their family needs most, whether that's paying for doctor visits, car repairs, rent, or even just keeping the lights on.

Studies show that for every \$1 spent on the federal child tax credit (of which the DETC is Maine's version), \$10 is returned to the economy.
