("An Act to Authorize a General Fund Bond Issue to Provide Funding for Affordable and Low-income Housing Programs")

We support the development and availability of all housing types including factory-built housing, modular housing, manufactured housing, tiny homes, and other types of housing for ownership or tenancy LD 690 would secure funding for the construction of additional units through a number of Maine State Housing Authority programs and this would help address the fundamental cause of Maine's housing shortage, a lack of supply. LD 690 incentivizes construction of affordable housing, which is a common-sense approach to increasing housing in our state.
