I am in strong support of LD 217, An Act to Require Schools to Provide Access to Free Condoms for Students in Grades 9 to 12 in the School Nurse's Office. As a parent of two children who attended all grades in the Belfast area school system, I value schools that can offer a safe place for children to access information and resources about sexual health.

Closing access to sexual health opportunities is a thing of the past. It's not a subject to be whispered about or condemned. We can do better.
