We also are concerned about the harmful chemicals made from petroleum, like PFAS, that were never tested prior to their introduction to our environment. Due to the powerful influence of petroleum and chemical industry lobbyists, the American people have become the lab test animals.

Maine has one of the worst PFAS problems in the nation due to the application of sewage sludge to farmland from the 1980s until 2022—and the 2024 spill at the Brunswick airport. It is upsetting that as Maine DEP continues to investigate, they have identified 500 sites of land contamination (Tier 4 sites) where records show that no sludge was ever applied. They are presently at a loss to explain why.
