MACDL understands this bill is meant to address situations whereby the courtappointed attorneys for incarcerated defendants may not receive notice of appointment for days or even weeks after the appointment happens in the courtroom.

Timely notice of appointment is critical to adequate defense because newly appointed counsel may seek to amend bail so that accused criminal defendants are able to return to work, home, and their families. Timely notice also means that an attorney can schedule a time to meet his or her new client in jails that often have limited hours for even attorney visits. These initial appointments are necessary to explore defenses and identify witnesses to interview.
