Hello, Senator Curry, Representative Gere and members of the Joint Standing Committee on Housing and Economic Development. I am Laura Mitchell, executive director of the Maine Affordable Housing Coalition. I am testifying in favor of LD1375 on behalf of the coalition, a nonprofit with 140 member businesses and more than 600 individual members.

Maine's HR&A Roadmap to Housing Production report identified numerous code and regulatory barriers to housing production. Some of these include broad requirements with signifant cost implications such as - sprinklers, double stairs, insulation levels, and others. The return on investment on these building requirements has been shown in prior versions of the building codes, and geographical locations, to cause more harm in terms of limiting housing production and loss of housing affordability, compared to minimal safety and efficiency benefits.

This resolve convenes a working group of experts including builders, developers, engineers and others that are working every day to meet Maine's housing needs to consider the benefits, safety considerations, and costs of Maine's regulations and building codes that have limited Maine as a state for economic and community wellbeing. A home is the foundation for a person or family to achieve stability and contribute to work, school, and their community.

We anticipate a wealth of ideas and recommendations from this work and fully support this effort to create an efficient, streamlined regulatory environment for housing that ensures the safety and affordability our housing market demands.

We urge you to vote in favor of LD1375 to address the many barriers we face so all Maine people have a home.
