RE:LD 1666—An Act to Include in the Ranked-choice Election Method for General and Special Elections the Offices of Governor, State Senator and State Representative and to Make Other Related Changes

Dear Senator Hickman, Representative Supica, and Members of the Joint Standing Committee on Veterans and Legal Affairs.

My testimony is in support of LD 1666. I am Janis Petzel, MD., and I live in the Town of Islesboro, Maine.

According to revresources.org, Rank choice voting (RCV) has been adopted in a wide range of jurisdictions across the USA, 62 of them as of 2022, from primaries to state and municipal elections. RCV allows for a sort of instant run off if no candidate gets more than 50% of the vote. We have seen the successful implementation of RCV for Federal elections in Maine.

I live in CD 2, which is well known to have a close mix of citizens. I was so relieved that RCV helped clarify the majority of voters' desires for Congressional leadership a couple of elections ago. RCV limits the "spoiler" effect of third-party candidates. Don't we want a wider choice of candidates without the risk of minority rule?

Indeed, experience with RCV shows that RCV cuts down on negative campaigning and shifts the focus back to a candidate's qualifications and ideas. In Maine, it's confusing that some elections use RCV and others don't.

Please fix this, for the better.

I urge you to vote ought to pass.
