As a Behavioral Health Specialist, I work to build everyday skills with young people with autism, disabilities and mental health disorders. Maine school systems are often strained to provide the resources to help these young people thrive. The learning styles that a Green School emphasizes, such as interdisciplinary, place-based, and project-based learning, lessen the strain on schools by equipping this community with inclusive and dynamic pathways for skill building, leadership opportunities, and community connection.

The mental health of my clients, and of Maine's students more generally, will also be supported by a Green Schools Network. By uplifting Maine's climate action plan *Maine Won't Wait*, which prioritizes climate education, a Green School will offer young people across Maine opportunities to improve core components of mental health, such as self-esteem, motivation, and connection. Consequently, young people will be healthier and more capable of helping Maine reach its climate goals.
