We are Americans who deserve to be seen as AmericanWe have been significant contributors to the U.S. economy, our communities, and more. We have contributed as much as anyone else and deserve to live free of discrimination. Awareness of our roles throughout American history, including the modern day, is a first step toward humanizing AANHPIs, as well as preventing people from considering all Asian Americans as "the same".
