As a life-long resident of Islesboro and a small island business owner, I see firsthand how vital the Maine State Ferry Service is to island communities. Ferries for year-round residents are not a luxury they are a lifeline. They ensure access to essential services like healthcare, education, employment, and supplies. They also sustain tourism and local economies. However, the decisions about how this system is funded, scheduled, and operated often feel disconnected from the realities of island life and sometimes leave islanders feeling as though our voices are not heard during the decision-making processes.

LD 1731 is a commonsense bill that takes an important step toward aligning the Maine State Ferry Service with the communities it serves. By increasing the advisory board's role in decision-making—particularly in funding and operational planning—the bill recognizes the deep local knowledge and lived experience of island residents.

Too often, decisions are made without adequate input from those most impacted. Or are made with disregard to the input provided from island communities. This leads to impractical schedules, unexpected fee hikes, and service interruptions that destabilize island life. LD 1731 will ensure that island voices are heard—early, consistently, and meaningfully—when it comes to policies that shape their future.

Islanders are asking to be true partners in making this system work. LD 1731 honors that spirit and makes our ferry system more responsive, equitable, and sustainable for everyone.

I respectfully urge the committee to vote "Ought to Pass" on LD 1731.
