I was turned away from CVS for a 6-month Covid booster for not being over 65. They said I needed a prescription. My nurse practitioner at the time refused. A school and hospice nurse told me masking is bad for my health, it's "not healthy to breathe all that carbon dioxide" and I look "crazy" wearing a mask. Time and research findings are showing otherwise and thankfully I have continued masking. We all have "Covid PTSD" to a certain extent in my opinion. We live out the results through many different beliefs that affect behaviors. One of these behaviors is ongoing, denial / refusal to admit the ongoing and mounting harm of the pandemic. Immune systems can't keep up with repeated infections and western medical providers are not prepared to recognize, understand, treat and refer people with these complications. It has long been known that infections can cause disease. Human papillomavirus infection (HPV) causes cervical cancer. Epstein-Barr virus (EBV) causes mono, spleen and liver complications, and potentially years of reoccurring symptoms among other things. Research is starting to show a connection between infections and Alzheimer's. Covid is causing a host of multi systemic diseases in even the youngest, previously healthiest patients. Providers need to know how the infections of today are causing the symptoms and new diagnoses of tomorrow. Our lives and futures literally depend on it. Please vote for this bill.
