RE: LD 1149 – An Act to Require an Individual to Present Photographic  
Identification for the Purpose of Voting

Dear Sen. Hickman, Rep. Supica, and members of the Joint Standing Committee on  
Veterans and Legal Affairs,

I'm writing to urge the committee to oppose LD 1149, and I appreciate your  
consideration as you review all the testimony submitted about this bill for the May 2  
public hearing.

I live in Warren, and I'm extremely concerned about the possible consequences this  
bill would have on Maine's already-strong voting system. I hope you join me in  
feeling proud of Maine's high voting rates, including our first-in-the-nation status in  
the 2022 election, and our historically high turnout in 2024. Should LD 1149 be  
passed into law, those turnout numbers will suffer because of the roadblocks the bill  
erects for our voters, especially those who rely on absentee voting, including  
home-bound and disabled Mainers and rural voters.

We already have safeguards in place to prevent fraud, cyber-attacks and other issues  
that would attempt to disrupt our elections, and those safeguards have been working  
just fine. Our current same-day voter registration, no-excuse absentee ballots, and no  
requirement of photo IDs have already been proven to work for us and our elections  
are secure. There is no reason at all to tamper with a good thing.

In short, disenfranchising Maine citizens from voting is a bad idea, and LD 1149  
would do just that.

I strongly encourage you to oppose LD 1149.
