Senator Carney, Representative Kuhn and Honorable Members of the Judiciary Committee,

Thank you for the opportunity to be heard by this committee. I am writing in opposition to a group of bills before this committee including: LD233, LD868, LD1002, LD1134, LD1704, LD1337, LD1432, LD380. As a Maine citizen, I view these bills as discriminatory and in violation of Maine's tradition of valuing all of its citizens.

I am a retired Licensed Clinical Professional Counselor (LCPC) with more than thirty five years of clinical practice. In all that time, I did not encounter a single case of someone being psychologically harmed by social or athletic contact with someone from the LGBTQ community. So, I would first challenge those advocating for these bills to "specify" the "harm" they believe this contact would cause. On the other hand, I have seen the elevated anxiety and depression, including suicidality, experienced by LGBTQ youth and young adults as a result of discriminatory language and behavior from members of the communities in which they reside. I do not believe the Maine legislature would want to codify this behavior and its consequences. These bills are simply unnecessary, without basis, and hold greater potential for harm than good.
