Title 29-A §2413-A, Motor vehicle violation resulting in death, authorizes the

court to impose a license suspension of between 14 days and 4 years. Title 29-A §2413, Driving to endanger, authorizes the court to impose a license suspension of between 30 and 180 days and additionally aggravated driving to endanger allows for a license suspension of 180 days to 2 years. Title 29-A §2454, Homicide, authorizes the Secretary of State to suspend a license for a minimum of 5 years for "any person who, as a result of the operation of a motor vehicle in such a manner
