Senator Talbot Ross, Representative Pluecker, and Members of the ACF Committee,
I am writing in strong support of L.D. 1771, An Act to Strengthen Oversight of
Kennels by Changing the Licensing Authority from Municipalities to the Department
of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry.

While most kennels in Maine are currently licensed through the state, there is a
smaller segment of kennels that don't fall under these rules and instead are licensed
through municipalities. Smaller, rural towns do not always have the resources to
properly track, inspect, and enforce animal welfare laws in these municipal kennels.
Some of these towns do not even have dedicated Animal Control Officers working for
them, meaning animals at these kennels can slip through the cracks and don't have the
protections our laws are designed to provide.

By shifting municipally licensed kennels to instead fall under the state's existing
kennel licensing system, L.D. 1771 would enable better records keeping, general
oversight, and enforcement of animal welfare laws.

Having uniformity in licensing and inspections for all types of kennels and ensuring
these facilities can be inspected by the state, not just towns, provides an additional
safeguard for the animals. Having all kennel licenses managed at a state level will
remove some of the financial and oversight burden from the towns and allow for state
support on animal welfare issues when needed. Animals are innocent and voiceless
and they deserve our love and protection. Humans have done wrong by animals (dogs
especially) for far too long now and we as a society need to take action to stop all of
the abuse that is seen in many breeding and kennel situations.

Please vote to move this commonsense bill forward.
