- Girls' restrooms have private stalls—privacy is not compromised.
- There is no evidence that trans and nonbinary students create safety risks in school bathrooms.
- Denying restroom access increases bullying, isolation, and harm.
- Schools are already handling this issue with care, privacy protections, and community awareness.
