Testimony Opposing LD 1432: An Act to Remove Consideration of Gender Identity from the Maine Human Rights Act

Chairpersons, members of the committee, and distinguished legislators,

My name is Karen MacDonald, and I am writing to express my strong opposition to LD 1432, a bill that would remove consideration of gender identity from the Maine Human Rights Act.

This is not just a matter of state policy; it is a matter of moral and legal responsibility. Courts and national legal standards increasingly affirm that gender identity is protected under anti-discrimination laws. Maine has long been a leader in human rights and inclusion. To walk backwards now would be to abdicate that leadership.

Passing LD 1432 would not just erase words from a statute—it would erase the lived experiences and legal protections of real people. I urge you to reject this bill and affirm the rights of all Mainers, including transgender and nonbinary individuals, to live free from discrimination.
