Senator Carney, Representative Kuhn, and Honorable Members of the Judiciary Committee:

As a clinical psychologist, I know that LD 1432 and similar bills would be simply devastating to Maine communities. We know that anti-trans legislation targeting protections based on gender identity cause depression and suicide in trans people and especially youth, and makes them targets of bullying and life-threatening violence. Bills like this are quite literally a matter of life or death for some of our most vulnerable neighbors. We are better than this.

Are you comfortable gambling with Mainer's lives for the sake of an anti-trans political agenda? Because protection from discrimination based on gender identity is relevant for ALL Mainer's, not just trans Mainer's. This bill would allow for discrimination against anyone who is determined not masculine/feminine "enough" - whatever that means. The proposed revision would further empower policing of adherence to gender norms, which unfairly scrutinizes girls' and women's bodies especially. If you claim to care about the safety of girls and women especially, you must NOT support this ambiguous and nonsensical bill.

Maine has long been considered a leader in human rights legislation, and now we must stand up against the national political agenda interfering with our rights to make our own laws. Any attempt to enforce this bill would blatantly violate our rights to autonomy and self-determination. Bills like this will also open the door and set a dangerous precedent for more extreme anti-trans legislation, further endangering Mainer's. LD 1432 is simply discriminatory on the basis of sex and it is NOT constitutional.

Thank you for the opportunity to share my perspective with the Committee. Changes to Maine law are unnecessary, and help no one--but the risk of harms is substantial. I urge you to vote "Ought not to Pass" on LD 1432 and similar bills today. Thank you.
