LD 1704: An Act to Prohibit a School Administrative Unit from Adopting a Policy That Allows a Student to Use a Restroom Designated for Use by the Opposite Sex

They deserve respect and grace for the courage they have to follow their truest self, while paving their own path with creativity and confidence. I ask you to oppose this bill being put forth today as a life saving measure for our trans and non-binary girls.
