My name is Zoey Bridges. I'm a Mainer, and a proud transgender woman. I'm here today to urge you to vote against LD 1432, which would remove gender identity from the Maine Human Rights Act.

What this bill proposes is not neutrality—it is cruelty disguised as policy. The Human Rights Act exists to protect those who are most at risk of being treated unfairly. This is not just about me—it's about every young trans person growing up in this state who deserves to know they belong. It's about every family trying to raise a transgender child with hope and safety. It's about ensuring that all Mainers can live without fear of being treated as less than human.

I love Maine. This is my home. I am your neighbor, your coworker, and your community member. Like everyone else here, I deserve to be protected under the law.
