Senator Carney, Representative Kuhn, and Honorable Members of the Judiciary Committee;

Thank you for the opportunity to address the committee. My name is Anne Dunham and I am a resident of Bath, Maine. I am here in opposition to the bills before the committee today.

These bills (LD233, LD 868, LD1002, LD 1134, LD1704, LD 1337, LD 1432, and LD 380) degrade the school, medical, and cultural climate in Maine by singling out a small minority of folks and preventing them from participating in their communities as their full selves. Some of these bills claim to be protective of women and girls. These laws will sanction invasive checks, embolden harassment, and fail to address far more substantive concerns such as the rape kit backlog and domestic violence.

The consequences of these laws will reliably increase the sensation of hostility toward transgender people. This population already experiences a suicide rate of eight times the overall US population.
