Re: LD 1945 - An Act to Clarify Data Collection Processes in Health Care Facilities

Senator Ingwersen, Representative Meyer and members of the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services, thank you for the opportunity to provide information in opposition to LD 1945, *An Act to Clarify Data Collection Processes in Health Care Facilities*.

This bill provides that health care facilities may collect sexual orientation and gender identity data only from individuals aged 18 or older, and only at the time other demographic information is gathered. It also removes existing language that specifies which data must be collected.

Passage of this bill eliminates certain health record data collection, creating misalignment with national data standards established under the federal Uniform Data System in 2016.

The data being removed from statute has been collected in alignment with national standards since 2016 and is typically gathered alongside other patient health information during routine intake.

Passage of the bill would create discrepancies between state and national health databases, hindering the ability of public health departments to collect and analyze data critical to understanding disease impacts and treatment disparities.
