MAR supports policies which preserve and protect the economic interests of the real estate industry and the right of all people to own, use, and transfer real property. This proposal would encourage continued development and innovative housing options.

MAR believes that housing needs are best met through private investment and recognizes the value of public incentives to accomplish the development of housing of all types. LD 1912 carefully balances this concept. This proposal would encourage more efficiencies in manufactured housing development which is needed to address our state's housing shortage.
