Senator Carney, Representative Kuhn, and Honorable Members of the Judiciary Committee,

Thank you for the opportunity to write to the Committee. My name is Hannah DeAngelis, I'm a resident of Portland, I grew up in Readfield, and I am the parent of a 1 year old and a 3 year old. I am writing to voice my support for bill LD1971.

As the former director of Catholic Charities's refugee resettlement program in Maine for seven years, I am familiar with the way that new immigrants to Maine are oriented to local police and to ICE in our state. A conflation of these two bodies does not make our community safer. In fact, this kind of partnership would result in a decrease in trust in local law enforcement and make immigrant communities less likely to come forward with information that could help solve or prevent crime.

As a parent of two small children, I am also very invested in how everyone in our community, of all immigration statuses, can feel that they are welcome in our city. I do not believe the increased presence of ICE and collaboration of ICE with local police makes our communities' safer. I think we are all safer, and my young family is safer, when everyone in our community does not live in constant fear of arrest and deportation.
