We support this proposal which would secure state resources to fund preventative measures and remediation tools for well-owners. Housing affordability and inventory remain a central focus as we discuss our state's policy needs. Being able to support existing property owners as they navigate the safety of their property's infrastructure ensures we are able to keep Mainers in their homes. This support is an essential resource to preserving existing housing supply and ensuring our citizens have access to safe drinking water.
