Good afternoon, Senator Ingwersen, Representative Strout and distinguished members of the Committee on Health and Human Services My name is Krysta West. Maine’s heritage industries are often low margin, capital intensive, high stress sectors and, in some cases, are isolated and independent work. While we would caution that poor mental health and a lack of wellness can impact any profession, we do appreciate the specific consideration of heritage industries.
