Public schools, libraries, daycares, and other institutions in Maine are increasingly becoming less safe due to ICE activity. We are already seeing children being kept home from school to protect them from ICE. Families are living in deep fear and anxiety, afraid to take their children to school, seek healthcare, and more. Keeping ICE out of these public spaces ensures all childrens' health and wellbeing. The children of Maine deserve to feel safe at school, at home and at every moment in their lives.

From the Immigrant Legal Advocacy Project — “LD 2106 would require ICE to have a valid judicial warrant signed by a judge to conduct enforcement at schools, hospitals and healthcare facilities, daycares, and libraries as well as protect people’s information that might be held at these places. Importantly, the bill also provides guidance and support to teachers, healthcare workers, and other employees at these locations, ensuring they are not put in crisis situations and forced to make individual decisions.”

LD 2106 would protect Maine children, parents, teachers, healthcare workers, and all of us by denying ICE access to schools, healthcare facilities, daycares, and libraries without a valid judicial warrant. This is critical to community health and well being. Schools are places for learning, exploration, and opportunity. Not immigration enforcement.

Please support LD 2106 and help Maine become a safe place for all children of all backgrounds. This state has the opportunity to protect and stand up for our own, so be part of the action that defines us for the years to come. Protect our children from the illegal and cruel entity that is ICE!
