

Testimony of Paul Schlein
in opposition to LD 2106, “An Act to Prohibit the Disclosure of Nonpublic Records Without Proper
Judicial Review”
addressed to the Committee on Judiciary
January 26, 2026

Dear Senators and Representatives of the Committee on Judiciary, my name is Paul Schlein, I reside in the Town of Arrowsic, I am writing to you to strongly urge your support of LD 2106, “An Act to Prohibit the Disclosure of Nonpublic Records Without Proper Judicial Review.”

As LD 2106 states, *at a minimum*, under no circumstances should any representative of U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), or representatives of any federal immigration agency, be allowed to access the non-public records of any public institution without proper legal authorization.
