Re: Testimony in support of LD 2106: An Act to Prohibit the Disclosure of Nonpublic Records

Without Proper Judicial Review

Honorable members of the Judiciary Committee, my name is Isabelle Rogers and I am testifying in support of LD 2106, *An Act to Prohibit the Disclosure of Nonpublic Records Without Proper Judicial Review*.

All Mainers should be able to freely seek information, referrals, and services at public libraries. All Maine residents should be able to seek help when they're sick or injured and share public health information. Maine's teachers, healthcare workers, childcare workers, and librarians should not have to feel afraid to go to work.

LD 2106 would protect Maine's public health by ensuring people safety at public schools, hospitals and healthcare facilities, daycares, and libraries in the state. It would prohibit state and federal law officers, engaged with immigration enforcement, from entering these locations without the display of a valid judicial warrant signed by a judge. The bill would also ensure any information about an individual's status or citizenship that is held by these entities is properly protected, unless federal law or a valid judicial warrant compels its sharing.

Maine's communities are vibrant, hardworking, and resilient. I urge you to vote in favor of LD 2106 to ensure all Maine workers and children can be safe in our state.
