

Testimony on LD 2106 for public hearing of the Judiciary Committee

I am submitting testimony in favor of LD 2106, “An Act to Prohibit the Disclosure of Nonpublic Records Without Proper Judicial Review” because I believe that it is wrong for federal law enforcement officers to be able to enter non-public spaces or access records without a judicial warrant. This isn’t a partisan matter, this is about civil liberties and upholding the rule of law. I appreciate this committee and the Legislature taking this up as an emergency bill given the current, and potential, federal law enforcement activities in our state.

Every resident of Maine should be able to seek healthcare, go to school, attend religious services, and visit libraries and other public spaces without fear of being detained by immigration or border patrol officers.
