Good afternoon Senator Rafferty, Representative Murphy, and members of the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs,

My name is Amy Sassi and I am the Director of Government Affairs for Good Shepherd Food Bank. Please vote ought to pass on LD 2064, An Act to Expand Access to Early Childhood Nutrition by Establishing a Grant Program for Public Preschools.

According to the [latest data provided by Feeding America](#), 20.6 percent of Maine children, or 50,610, experience hunger, compared to the national average of 17 percent. The following is childhood hunger measured in each county, with the highest rate in Washington County at 27.3 percent and the lowest rate in Cumberland County at 15.8 percent. Each county except for Cumberland are higher than the national average.

Good Shepherd Food Bank supports emergency food in 600 organizations across the state, including 130 schools. We support programs specifically for pre-k students through KVCAP at EduCare in Waterville, and at all six of Community Concepts' childcare and pre-k programs in Oxford and Franklin counties. This bill will provide grant funds for these and other pre-k programs to cover school meals for students which are not currently reimbursed through the National School Lunch Program, and a grant program for infrastructure necessary to provide breakfast, lunch, and snack.
