Senator Ingwersen, Representative Pluecker, and members of the Committee, I am Brian Kavanah, Director of the Bureau of Water Quality at the Department of Environmental Protection. I am speaking in support of L.D. 315.

As I noted during the Committee briefing on February 1, with Deputy Commissioner McBrady, regarding the legislative irrigation report required by L.D. 1998, the DEP interacts with farmers in various ways regarding irrigation. Most importantly, there are regulatory requirements for water withdrawals directly from surface waters. The DEP understands the importance of irrigation to Maine's farmers. We are supportive of

assistance to farmers to help them develop irrigation ponds and wells to

reduce direct withdrawals from surface waters which, during times of even

moderate drought, will likely not have the capacity to support direct

withdrawal for irrigation and still meet state water quality standards.

Also, as outlined in the L.D. 1998 report, farmers could benefit from a

variety of assistance services from DACF and DEP that the agencies do

not now have the capacity to provide, particularly in Aroostook County

which has historically been underserved.

In closing, enactment of L.D. 315 would fill this important gap in funding

and services. I ask your support of L.D. 315 and I would be happy to
