You have important rights worthy of protection, and the Office of the District Attorney will avoid engaging in any unwanted discussions regarding your case until those rights are explained to you.

M.R.U. Crim. P. 11A states that "[t]he attorney for the State and the attorney for the defendant or *the defendant when unrepresented* may engage in discussions with a view toward reaching an agreement..." as to the disposition of the case. More importantly, the Maine State Constitution grants the accused "a right to be heard by himself and his counsel, or either, at his election." Me. Const. art. 1§ 6. The Maine Supreme Judicial Court has recognized the right of the accused to self-representation. State v. Carter, 412 A.2d 56, 60-61 (Me.1980) (citing Faretta v. California, 422 U.S. 806 (1975)).

In light of the above, I am prepared to offer you the following recommendation.

On a plea to THEFT BY UNAUTHORIZED TAKING, I will recommend \$250 fine plus \$6.99 restitution plus surcharges.

You must appear in court on your scheduled arraignment date.

You may explain any circumstances to the Judge or ask for time to pay the fine. This offer expires on March 8, 2023.

A Maine Statute does not allow a prosecutor or a prosecutor's office to communicate directly with a defendant until after an arraignment and only if a written waiver of the right to an attorney is executed.
