## Testimony on LD 1475

## Mark Gallagher representing the Biotechnology Organization (BIO)

Senator Grohoski, Representative Perry and distinguished members of the Joint Standing Committee on Taxation, my name is Mark Gallagher, and I am a Senior Consultant and Shareholder at Drummond Woodsum Strategic Consulting located in Portland. Today, I am here to testify in support of LD 1475, "An Act to Promote Biomanufacturing and Biotechnology Development by Establishing a Tax Credit" on behalf of my client the Biotechnology Innovation Organization or BIO, for short.

BIO is the world's largest advocacy association representing member companies, state biotechnology groups, academic and research institutions, and related organizations across the United States and in more than 30 countries. BIO members are involved in the research and development of innovative healthcare, agricultural, industrial, and environmental biotechnology products.
