**“Act to Ensure Municipalities Receive a Higher Percentage of All-terrain Vehicle
Registration Fees to Cover Increased Expenses”**

DATE OF HEARING: April 24, 2023

Good afternoon Senator LaFountain, Representative Landry and members of the Inland Fisheries and Wildlife Committee. I am Tim Peabody, Deputy Commissioner of the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife, speaking on behalf of the Department, neither for nor against **L.D. 296**.

This bill is a concept draft pursuant to Joint Rule 208. This bill would ensure municipalities receive a higher percentage of income from all-terrain vehicle registration fees to cover increased expenses.

The department spoke to the bill sponsor and our understanding is that the Town of Belgrade asked the sponsor to bring this forward due to concerns over the process time to register ATVs and the increased hourly wages being paid to clerks. They recognized that there had been an increase in the registration fee for ATVs but did not see an increase in their agent portion. They feel the process time is no longer worth the agent fee of \$2 for a new registration and a \$1 for renewals. We provided the Belgrade Town Clerk information/background on the 2020 ATV Task Force Report that requested to have a registration increase to support the maintenance of the trails and did not address the agent fee portion of the registration or any change in the existing split of the registration fee.

IFW has discussed this bill with staff at DACF and we all agree that attempting to modify the ATV registration fee now when it just increased significantly in 2021 would not be supported. However, we do feel that a discussion is warranted in reference to a possible agent fee increase because the current fees have not been increased in 20 + years
