Senator Carney, Representative Moonen, and Honorable Members of the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary:

My name is Silas Schrader, and I'm a resident of Pembroke. I'm here to testify in opposition to LD 1619.

This bill, LD 1619, introduces abortion on demand at any time during pregnancy in the state of Maine. To put this into perspective, this means that abortions can be done on the same day the child would be conceived, which means that the child's right to live and not to live is separated by mere seconds.

I will not dwell long on the barbarity of this procedure, like how, for instance, the child has to be torn apart limb by limb until the head is reached, at which point it is smashed so that it will be small enough to be pulled out.
