Senator Carney, Representative Mooney, Honorable members of the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary, My name is Melanie Blair from Lisbon. I am here to testify against LD 1619.

To begin with, I am against this bill because medically necessary abortions are already covered by Maine state law. Maine Law presently provides exception to the viability restriction to save the life or health of the mother or in the case of a fetal fatal diagnosis. With the vast advancements in medical science, we now know that at the moment of fertilization, a new unique human embryo with unique DNA is created. We now know that even at the early stage an individual human life exists. We now know that the unborn baby's heart begins to beat at three weeks old, that the brain waves can be detected as early as five weeks, and that all of the unborn babies organs are fully formed by 24 weeks.
