Senator Carney, Representative Moonen, and Honorable Members of the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary:

My name is Tracy Santos, and I'm a resident of Parkman. I'm here to testify in opposition to LD 1619.

Thank you for the opportunity to speak here today.

In thinking about the possibilities connected with the proposed legislation of LD 1619, I decided to have a close look at the Constitution of the State of Maine. What I found in Section 1 of the Declaration of Rights is, "All people are born equally free and independent, and have certain natural, inherent and unalienable rights, among which are those of enjoying and defending life and liberty, acquiring, possessing and protecting property, and obtaining safety and happiness."

I'm very thankful to be here today to defend life as is my natural right under this constitution. I'm afraid, however, that this proposed legislation, which would remove ALL restrictions on abortion up until birth, flies in the face of our own state constitution.
