Hello,

Honorable Members of the Transportation Committee.

My name is Alicia Collins. I am a resident and a selectman in the town of Sidney.

I am speaking today in opposition to LD1138, An Act to Improve Work and Family Mobility by Altering and Removing Certain Requirements for Driver's Licenses and Nondriver Identification Cards.

The Secretary of State disenfranchised voters less than a month ago, by removing a legitimate Presidential candidate from the Maine primary ballot.

- I stood in the cold for several hours on election day, collecting signatures for multiple Presidential candidates. I think I may have wasted my day.
  - Why should I even vote?

The Veteran's and Legal Affairs committee heard testimonies last week on the National Popular-Vote – a way to water down the votes of the citizens of Maine.

- Living in Congressional District 2, and knowing Maine is one of the few states to split its electoral votes, I am concerned my vote may no longer count.
  - Why should I even vote?

And today this committee is hearing testimonies to allow non-citizens to obtain driver's licenses.

The attachment to my testimony is from the Secretary of State's website. It is a voter registration card. You will notice I have highlighted the documentation requirement to register – a Maine driver's license or Maine State ID.

- Living in Maine, I wonder, with Governor Mills proposing we accept 75,000 more noncitizens and allowing them access to our elections via a State of Maine ID or license, how watered down is my vote?
  - Why should I even vote?

Finally, our Constitution was set up as a Representative Republic, not a Democracy.

Who do you represent?

Don't you care about your constituents?

Do you think it is fair for non-citizens, who do not have a part in our tax system, to become part of our election process?

The Secretary of State has already disenfranchised voters. Does the State Legislature want to disenfranchise voters more?
