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## Introducing LD 2153, An Act to Clarify MaineCare Copayments

## January 24, 2024

Senator Baldacci, Representative Meyer and my esteemed colleagues of the Health and Human Services Committee, I am here today to introduce **LD 2153**, **An Act to Clarify MaineCare Copayments**, on behalf of the Department of Health and Human Services.

## The bill would

- 1. Prohibit Mainecare from requiring copayments for <u>Primary Care</u> and <u>community-based behavioral health services</u>. This move would be wise because of the tremendous *health* benefit of removing barriers to primary care and behavioral health services in the community. There also would likely be a *system* benefit for all of us, through reduced utilization of Emergency Rooms and inpatient units. This would reduce costs to MaineCare, and increase availability of these scarce resources for those who truly need emergency care and/or hospitalization.
- 2. Clean up Maine Statute to align with federal statute in Title 42 US Code, Section 1396a(a)(30)(A).
