Today I am here in favor of LD 1877. A vital Bill that will lift the most vulnerable families from surviving to thriving.

It is a privilege for me to be here standing before you as a past participant in the TANF Program. I am advocating for a 60% increase in the cash benefit that hasn't had an increase since 1991 - 33 years ago.

This is what a 60% increase means - higher education, employment, sober families, and enriched lives.

My family has problems too grand to share here today but here is a list of what I observe: Alcohol dependence, multiple mental disorders, and sometimes they hit each other.

Coming from a background of trauma has helped to build my resilience in making the bare minimum work which is not ideal. I know that infrastructure can be put In place in 2024 to help poor people sustain themselves and their loved ones.

LD1877 would take a step in reducing low-income families living in generational poverty in Kennebec County and all of Maine. This will boost self-esteem and confidence in parents and children to thrive short term and long term. Your assistance is crucial in making this change happen. It's an intelligent investment with dignifying rewards for my state and our state's holistic well-being.
