I am State Representative Scott Wynn Cyrway, and I proudly represent District 63, which includes Albion, Freedom, Unity Township, and a portion of Winslow. It is an honor to appear before you today for the purpose of introducing of L.D. 2123, “*An Act Regarding Licensure of Emergency Medical Services Persons.*”

This legislation seeks to amend the law governing the minimum requirements for the licensing and relicensing of emergency medical personnel by removing the requirement that a person must have successfully completed the practical evaluation of emergency medical treatment skills approved by the Emergency Medical Services’ Board and replacing it with a requirement that an individual must have successfully completed an assessment of emergency medical treatment skills approved by the Emergency Medical Services’ Board.
